The History Boys

"Pass it on boys... that's the game I wanted you to learn... pass it on"

Set in the 1980's, **The History Boys** is the story of a group of bright, funny and unruly sixth-formers in pursuit of sex, sport and a place at university. Their maverick English teacher is at odds with the young and shrewd supply teacher, whilst their headmaster is obsessed with results and league tables. Staffroom rivalry and the anarchy of adolescence overflow, provoking not only universal questions about the nature of history and how it is taught but also questions about the purpose of education today.

Their A Levels may be over, but the real learning has just begun...

Celebrating it's 20th Anniversary and hailed as "one of the finest plays Alan Bennett has ever written", **The History Boys** opened at the National Theatre in 2004 to rave reviews, a sell-out run and went on to become one of their biggest ever hits, winning over 30 major awards including the Olivier and Tony Awards for Best New Play. In a recent national survey this comic masterpiece was voted the nation's favourite play.

STAFF:

HECTOR: A man of studied eccentricity. He prides himself in not teaching to an exam, or any prescribed path. He teaches his students to learn by heart, driven by a belief in the pursuit of knowledge for its own sake. He is met with different reactions. He is known for allowing his emotions to effect his teaching. Playing age: 60

IRWIN: is a young history teacher, employed for his innovative approach to education. The antithesis of Hector, he believes that education is for now, and teaches an approach which subverts facts to find an original and interesting argument. He believes in presentation, and history as performance. Playing age: 25 - 35

MRS LINTOTT: is a 'traditional' History teacher, she gets excellent results, and does not allow her emotions to interfere with her teaching. She comments that as the only woman on the staff, she is often overlooked, and this clearly frustrates her. Playing age: 50 - 60

THE HEADMASTER: is a typical headmaster with authority, concerned with league tables, and getting students into Oxbridge. "Our fearless leader". His understanding of the arts is limited. Playing age: 50 - 60

STUDENTS:

- **DAKIN**: is an attractive boy, who is very aware of it. Despite having both Posner and eventually Irwin interested in him, he is only interested in Fiona, the Headmaster's secretary. Nonetheless, he enjoys indulging Irwin's desires.
- **POSNER**: is a quiet Jewish boy who loves singing, from show tunes to hymns and is in love with Dakin. Looks and is young for his age. He sings.
- **SCRIPPS**: is currently predisposed with exploring his Christianity, is a budding writer, and often records events in is notebook. He is Posner's confident. Plays piano.
 - **RUDGE**: is a star rugby player whose ability surprises everyone. He finds Irwin's ways difficult due to his straightforward nature. Not as bright at the other boys.

AKTHAR: is happy to get involved in the class's testing of Irwin and is a Muslim.

CROWTHER: is a keen actor and friends with Lockwood.

TIMMS: is the joker of the pack and often subject to a whack from Hector as a result.

LOCKWOOD: is a shrewd film buff, interested in politics.

Christopher, fifteen years old, stands beside Mrs Shears' dead dog. It has been speared with a garden fork, it is seven minutes after midnight, and Christopher is under suspicion. He records each fact in the book he is writing to solve the mystery of who murdered Wellington. He has an extraordinary brain and is exceptional at maths, but he is illequipped to interpret everyday life. He has never ventured alone beyond the end of his road, he detests being touched, and he distrusts strangers. But Christopher's detective work, forbidden by his father, takes him on a frightening journey that turns his world upside-down.

Simon Stephens' adaptation of Mark Haddon's bestselling, award-winning novel, *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time* offers a richly theatrical exploration of this touching and bleakly humorous tale.

This production is performed by THE GARRICK ENSEMBLE.

The Garrick Ensemble is a company of 18 – 30 year old aspiring actors from Greater Manchester and Cheshire who perform one production each year as part of the Altrincham Garrick Playhouse Main House Season. The production will be directed by Artistic Director Joseph Meighan.

The Garrick Ensemble aims to make theatre that is fresh, innovative and exciting. See the very best of local, up and coming talent before they move forward in the next stages of their careers in the Arts.

Christopher: Christopher is particularly adept at math and space, but finds people confusing. He is searching for the killer of his neighbours dog, Wellington. Christopher is an autistic person who is exploring his place in the world as he seeks to solve the mystery of Wellington's death. Actors with autism are encouraged to audition.

Siobhan: Christopher's teacher. Warm and encouraging, Siobhan sometimes acts as narrator and sometimes acts as a calming voice in Christopher's head.

Ed: Christopher's father. A determined, patient and caring, but stubborn parent. He is harbouring two huge lies that cause the breakdown of his relationship with his son.

Judy: Christopher's mother. She had an affair and left her family when she couldn't cope with Christopher's behaviour and the strain it put on her marriage, although she is honest and open about her shortcomings as a parent.

Actor One: Mrs. Shears (the wife of the man Judy is having an affair with), Mrs. Gascoyne, Woman on Train, Shopkeeper, Voice One

Actor Two: Roger Shears (the man Judy had an affair with and is living with), Duty Sergeant, Mr. Wise, Man Behind Counter, Drunk One, Voice Two

Actor Three: Policeman, Mr. Thompson, Drunk Two, Man with Socks, London Policeman, Voice Three

Actor Four: Reverend Peters, Uncle Terry, Station Policeman, Station Guard, Voice Four

Actor Five: No. 40, Lady in Street, Information, Punk Girl, Voice Five

Actor Six: Mrs. Alexander (an elderly neighbour who, although a gossip, is kind to Christopher. She reveals a dark secret to Christopher that sets his journey in motion), Posh Woman, Voice Six

Movement will play a big part in the story telling and all actors will practically be present throughout.

Monday 24th February - Saturday 1st March 2025

1939: fascism spreads across Europe, Franco marches on Barcelona and two German chemists discover the processes of atomic fission. In Berkeley, California, theoretical physicists recognise the horrendous potential of this new science: a weapon that draws its power from the very building blocks of the universe.

Struggling to cast off his radical past and thrust into a position of power and authority, the charismatic J Robert Oppenheimer races to win the 'battle of the laboratories' and create a weapon so devastating that it would bring about an end not just to the Second World War but to all war.

Originally written for the RSC in 2015, Tom Morton-Smith's play takes us into the heart of science, politics and humanity clashing in the propulsive story of the Manhattan Project and the development of the world's first nuclear bombs.

"Guys like us, that work on ranches, are the loneliest guys in the world. They got no family. They don't belong no place...with us it ain't like that. We got a future. We got somebody to talk to that gives a damn about us."

George and Lennie are migrants with a dream; a dream of a better life, a place where they can belong, where Lennie feels safe and George can be somebody. But this is the Great Depression, not many dreams come true in a time where a few have plenty but most have nothing. When the friends take a job on Curly's farm, tragedy unfolds leading to a heart-breaking decision.

John Steinbeck's classic novel is more than 80 years old, but with themes of economic migration, racism, prejudice and exclusion it remains a parable for our times.

A story of enduring friendship and hope.

George Milton

A small, quick-witted man who is Lennie's de facto guardian, traveling companion, fellow ranch hand, and best friend. Although he frequently complains about his caretaking responsibilities, he is obviously devoted to and protective of Lennie.

Lennie Small

A physically imposing, lumbering, and clumsy childlike man, also a migrant worker along with his friend and companion George. His mental disability means that he is almost entirely reliant upon George for guidance and protection, however Lennie looks up to his pal with a combination of awe, respect, and love. He is gentle and kind, but he has no conception of his own strength, which gets him into trouble.

Candy

An aging ranch handyman, Candy lost his hand in an accident some time ago. He worries about his future on the ranch and fears the arrival of the day when his age will make him useless to others. Candy has an ancient dog he loves dearly.

The Boss

The Boss is a stocky and well-dressed man in charge of the ranch George and Lennie land at. He is also Curley's father. He is stern but fair-minded employer. He makes only one appearance on stage.

Curley

The Boss' son: a young, impetuous, and combative character. He obviously has several chips on his shoulder, many of them regarding his newly acquired wife of two weeks and the way the other ranch hands look at her. His jealousy and frequent losses of temper serve to accentuate his essential pettiness - and his inadequacies.

Curley's Wife

Only known throughout the whole play by her relationship to her new husband Curley and a string of unpleasant epithets from the ranch hands, she is a victim of time and place. Young, pretty, and isolated as the only woman in the play, she is, like many of the ranch hands, desperately lonely and has broken dreams of a different life.

Slim

The consummate ranch hand and the main driver of the mule team, Slim is called the "prince of the ranch." And for good reason - he is tall, good looking, strong, and greatly respected by the other characters for his physical abilities around the ranch as well as his treatment of the other workers.

Carlson

Another one of the ranch hands, he is a thick-bodied man who constantly complains about the smell of Curley's old dog. Carlson is a simple man who enjoy simple pleasures, but he has little sympathy for Curley when convinces him to let him take the dog out back and shoot it.

Whit

Another one of the ranch hands, noted as a youngish labourer. He is amiable and goodnatured, but a bit of a pushover. He and Carlson are in company together for much of the play, though when it comes down to it he is the only one who takes Candy's side over the killing of the dog - but only for a moment before resigning himself to the group's will.

Crooks

The proud, bitter, and somewhat cynical black stable-hand, Crooks gets his name, it is indicated in the script, from his crooked back. He lives by himself and is largely shunned by the other ranch hands - and he actively shuns them back, regarding any offers of kindness with suspicion. This bitterness stems from a combination of loneliness and the extremely pervasive, casual prejudices held by the country at the time this story takes place.

VARDY V ROONEY: The Wagatha Christie Trial

A story stranger than fiction that blurs the boundaries of tabloid scoop, court case and soap opera, *The Wagatha Christie Trial* explores privacy and celebrity in modern Britain.

On 9 October 2019, Coleen Rooney publicly accused Rebekah Vardy of selling stories about her to The Sun. The four words "It's....... Rebekah Vardy's account" sent shockwaves across British and global press. Nobody could have expected the social media scandal to grow so large.

On 10 May 2022, the "Wagatha Christie" trial commenced. Over seven days, the libel court case saw Vardy and Rooney remark on each other's lives, with much of it documented heavily in the press.

Only a handful of people witnessed what happened behind the closed doors of this footballers' wives drama and now you can too in this hilarious (and slightly tacky) court room comedy!

You'll be on the edge of your seat as you relive the high-profile case, filled with drama, intrigue, and scandal.

*Vardy V Rooney: The Wagatha Christie Tria*l was first performed at the Wyndham's Theatre in the West End in 2022 before a UK and Ireland tour.

Waiting for Godot

Two wandering tramps, Vladimir and Estragon, wait by a lonely tree, to meet up with Mr. Godot, an enigmatic figure in a world where time, place and memory are blurred and meaning is where you find it.

The tramps hope that Godot will change their lives for the better. Instead, two eccentric travellers arrive, one man on the end of the other's rope. The results are both funny and dangerous in this existential masterpiece.

When Samuel Beckett's play exploded on to the London stage in 1953, it shocked as many people as it delighted. There had never been a play like it; indeed it was said that: "Beckett has achieved a theoretical impossibility—a play in which nothing happens, that yet keeps audiences glued to their seats."

Today, *Waiting for Godot* is accepted as one of the most significant plays of the 20th century.

Owen - Male

Son to Hugh; Brother to Manus. He is the primary character who is torn between the obvious necessity of progress and his unwillingness to see the land he grew up in and the people he loves get erased to make progress happen.

Lieutenant Yolland - Male

He is the romantic. He is English, and works for them, but he is a "Hibernophile," or someone who is in love with the mysticism and lore of Ireland. He falls for Maire.

Manus - Male

Son to Hugh; Brother to Owen. He is stuck in a difficult position to want to make a life for himself, but not abandon or step over his father to get there. He has romantic feelings for Maire, but knows she won't consider him seriously until he's made something of himself.

Maire - Female

She seems set on learning English and heading to America because that's where she feels she'll be free from a life that will keep her down. She cares for Manus, but doesn't want to commit to someone with no prospects. She then is attracted to Yolland, who has position, and speaks English.

Hugh - Male

60. A smart, nostalgic man who has made a career out of drinking and teaching the locals. He lacks vision, but teaches the past very well. He is sure of himself, and even more sure when he has many drinks in him.

Jimmy Jack - Male

60. A human encyclopaedia on Greek mythology. Can recite whole portions of Horace, Ovid, or Homer from memory. He lives half in this world loving mythology and scaring away young girls, and half in the world of myth, trying to find a cure for a life of alcoholism and loneliness.

Captain Lancey - Male

The cold, calculated official in charge of England's renaming campaign in Ireland. He tries to be civil, but it's clear that he's trying (not succeeding). His true nature is in getting things done, and letting people know who is in charge, and who's under the boot.

Sarah - Female

She communicates well with people, though she has a speech impediment which renders her virtually incapable of speaking. She uses non-verbal communication primarily to pass information along. She's warm, good-natured, and in love with Manus, though she can't tell him.

Bridget - Female

Town gossip, and spitfire! She has a natural inclination toward mischievous behaviour, and then telling in great detail and with great vigor "exactly what happened." She is habitually partnered with her alter-ego, Doalty.

Doalty - Male or Female

A practical joker and general shenanigan-organiser. He/she can't do math, or translate Latin, but can surely make fun of people and mess with the English's campaign. He/she

sees himself/herself as an iconoclast (a revolutionary), when really, he's/she's more like the lovable village idiot.
