
ALTRINCHAM GARRICK PLAYHOUSE - AUDITION INFORMATION:

Rehearsals

Rehearsals will be every Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 7.30pm - 10pm, and every Sunday from 2pm - 5.30pm.

We do ask that all those auditioning are able to make every rehearsal. We do, of course, understand that sometimes you may have other commitments and special occasions during the rehearsal process, and we therefore ask that you inform us of any dates you are not available in advance (at the audition) and we will try and make this work. If you have a date that you're unable to rehearse within ten days of the opening night (23rd February) we may have to ask you to withdraw from the production.

You may not be called to every rehearsal, and the Director will produce a rehearsal schedule as far in advance as possible, but we do still ask that those successful in being cast in the production remain flexible, as rehearsal schedules can often change during the process.

Jane Marple, confined to a chair after an accident, is wondering if life has passed her by. Then there is a vicious murder, and Miss Marple must unravel a web of lies, tragedy and danger.

This adaptation of Agatha Christie's 1962 novel, *The Mirror Crack'd*, brings real emotional depth and psychological insight to a thrilling story of revenge and the dark secrets that we all hide.

But can anything be hidden from Miss Marple, the sweet old lady with mind like a steel trap?

Characters

Miss Jane Marple

Playing Age: 65+

The astute and observant amateur detective, gossipy, but known for her shrewd understanding of human nature. Miss Marple is elderly but very sharp, with a keen eye for detail.

Cherry Baker

Playing Age: Mid 20s

Miss Marple's enthusiastic and well-meaning help - cleaning / cooking. Working class. Croydon accent.

Heather Leigh

Playing Age: Mid 30s - Late 40s

A lively and enthusiastic fan of Marina Gregg. She is full of energy and well meaning but somewhat oblivious to the impact of her words. Our victim.

Dolly Bantry

Playing Age: 60+:

A friend of Miss Marple and the former owner of Gossington Hall, where the murder occurs, a source of all the local gossip. Well spoken.

Marina Gregg

Playing Age: Late 40s/Early 50s

A famous film star, glamorous yet troubled. She has returned to England after a long career in Hollywood and is at a pivotal point in her life, dealing with personal and emotional struggles.

Ella Zielinsky

Playing Age: 30s – 40s

The efficient personal assistant, sharp and ambitious. Polish.

Lola Brewster

Playing Age: 20s

A young film actress, with her own dark past! American accent.

Chief Inspector Dermot Craddock

Playing Age: 40+

A classic 'Christie' police officer, behind the times and workman like in his approach.

Cyril Leigh

Playing Age: Late 30s - 40s

Heather's gentle husband; a silent partner in that marriage, but with inner strength. A small but significant comic role.

Jason Rudd

Playing Age: 50s

Marina Gregg's devoted husband and film director. He is very protective of Marina and is trying to help her through her difficulties while maintaining their public image. American accent.

Giuseppe Renzo

Playing Age: 40+

Marina Gregg's butler, very protective of her. Italian American. Italian/ American accent.
